

Overview of the B1 Preliminary Speaking test – Teacher’s notes

Description

The overview lesson starts with a card matching exercise that gets learners to sort and match up different sections of the exam with their relevant features, then compare them with a projected overview before finally answering a questionnaire worksheet about the B1 Preliminary Speaking test.

Time required: 30 minutes

Materials required:

- B1 Preliminary Handbook for teachers digital copy or page 52 scanned to be projected
- Student handout 1 (cut into cards)
- Student handout 2
- Speaking test video (optional)

Aims:

- to learn about the format and features of B1 Preliminary Speaking test.

Procedure

1. Cut up several copies of **Student handout 1** – one set of cards for each group of 3 or 4 students. Establish at this point that it’s not really important ‘to be right’ but just to put the cards into a logical sequence or pattern. Learners discuss their ideas in groups and then explain to the whole class how they have organised the cards. Do not comment at this stage.
2. Project the overview of the Speaking test from the **Handbook** (page 52) or a worksheet copy of this if projection facilities are not available. Talk through the overview and learners discuss/reform their own cards to match the projection.
3. Projection is then switched off, collect the cards from each group.
4. In pairs, students answer questionnaire on **Handout 2** remembering information from steps 1 and 2.
5. Manage feedback on overview, eliciting peer correction: e.g. ‘Maria and Elia think that Part 3 is an individual turn – are they right?’, only correcting if necessary.
6. Hand out cards from step 1 again and tell groups they have to organise them in ‘double quick time’ (for example a minute or even 30 seconds for stronger learners) and that they should be accurate with their answers! At the end of the time the projection should be displayed and answers checked.
7. Randomly ask individual learners to answer selected questions from the questionnaire worksheet.
8. Watch a full B1 Preliminary Speaking test if there is time (optional).

2	3 minutes	Candidate extended turn	Extended turn	Candidate describes one colour photograph talking for about one minute
3	approx. 3 minutes	Candidate  Candidate	Discussion task with pictures	Make and respond to suggestions, discuss alternatives and negotiate agreement.
4	3 minutes	Candidate  Candidate	General conversation	Discuss likes, dislikes, experiences, opinions, habits, etc.
